Land Swap for Future Stony Plain Central School



September 14, 2020 - Parkland School Division in partnership with the Town of Stony Plain are pleased to announce details of a Land Swap Agreement that will pave the way for construction to begin on the replacement school for Stony Plain Central School.

At the August 19th Special Board Meeting, Parkland School Division's Board of Trustees passed the following:

The Board of Trustees accept, subject to the Minister's approval, the sale of lands located on the current Stony Plain Central and the Old Memorial Composite High School sites in exchange for a new Stony Plain Central School site and elimination of joint use costs for the next 29 years, as defined in the Land Swap Agreement as presented at the Special Board Meeting on August 19, 2020.

"Families at Stony Plain Central have been patiently and excitedly waiting for construction to begin for their replacement school that was announced in March of 2018. This recent transaction is fantastic news and indicates the start of visible and tangible progress to this exciting build that will serve Stony Plain students for years to come. The administrations teams for both the school division and the Town have worked successfully to create this win-win scenario. Having Stony Plain Central School as a hub in this future development is truly exciting for all involved." - Lorraine Stewart, Parkland School Division Board Chair

"The completion of the property development and land exchange for the new Stony Plain Central School site is an important milestone for our community. Together with the Parkland School Division, the Town has worked to facilitate the land sale and develop a new school for our residents. Recently, the Town of Stony Plain completed the servicing and paving of the 57th Avenue extension that will serve as one of the main access points to the future site of Stony Plain Central School. The contract for a building contractor is expected to be awarded by the end of this year.

COVID-19 INFORMATION

Stay at Home Guide

A resource to help parents understand when they should keep their child home from school and when it is safe to return to class.

The bottom line: students with symptoms must not attend school.

WHICH SYMPTOM DOES YOUR CHILD HAVE?

Does your child have ANY of these symptoms?

- fever
- cough (new cough or worsening chronic cough)
- shortness of breath or difficulty breathing (new or worsening)
- runny nose
- sore throat

Yes, that's my child. Now what?

If your child has any of the above symptoms that are not related to a preexisting health condition, you are **legally required** to have your child isolate for a minimum of 10 days or until symptoms resolve—whichever takes longer. Call Health Link 811 or your family doctor, and fill out the AHS Online Self-Assessment tool to determine if your child should be tested.

When can my child return to school?

Once your child completes the 10 day isolation or receives a negative COVID-19 test result and symptoms resolve, a return to school is possible once you submit PSD's Negative Test Declaration (www.psd70.ab.ca/COVID19.php).

Does your child have ANY of these symptoms?

- chills
- painful swallowing
- stuffy nose
- headache
- muscle or joint aches
- feeling unwell, fatigue or severe exhaustion
- gastrointestinal symptoms (nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or unexplained loss of appetite)
- loss of sense of smell or taste
- conjunctivitis (i.e. pink eye)

Yes, that's my child. Now what?

If your child has any of the above symptoms, you must keep them home from school until symptoms resolve. You should also minimize your child's contact with others.

When can my child return to school?

Once symptoms resolve, your child may return to class. There is no need to get a COVID-19 test or fill out any paperwork before returning to school.





REMEMBER

It is the parents' responsibility to screen their child(ren) for symptoms each day before school.

Visit psd70.ab.ca and click on the COVID-19 quick link to complete the COVID-19 Screening Questionnaire.



Alberta Health Services will be updating immunizations throughout the school year.

This will include last year's grade 6 students (now grade 7), for whom we were unable to complete the immunization series due to school closures. We will also continue with the programs for the current grade 6 and 9 students. Finally, as time allows, we will try to catch up any students in other grades who missed immunizations somewhere along the way.

Please note immunization consents provided last year remain valid until immunizations are completed.

Throughout the school year, other children who are identified as requiring immunization updates will receive a package. This package will contain information about the vaccines that your child is eligible for, along with a consent form for each vaccine. In order for your child to be immunized, each consent form must be signed and returned to your child's school by the date indicated on the envelope.

An immunization consent package from Alberta Health Services will soon be sent home with your child. Please check your child's school bag for this package which contains information about the vaccines that your child is eligible for in the <u>Grade 6</u> school-based immunization program, along with a consent form for each vaccine. In order for your child to be immunized, each consent form must be signed and returned to your child's school by the date indicated on the envelope.
