- ✓ Complete the rest of the registration form. (Including your email address will ensure you receive reminder emails about hot lunch order deadlines, and your child's hot lunch order for the upcoming week)
- ✓ Click the "Register Now" button at the bottom
- ✓ Follow the instructions to add each child in your family who attends SPC. Once your child(ren) are registered, click on "Orders"
- ✓ Proceed to order hot lunch for your child(ren)

AMH Caregiver Education **September 2022** Newsletter

The Caregiver Education Team is proud to offer free addiction and mental health virtual programming for parents and caregivers of children and youth, as well as new sessions for all adults.

Please feel free to share this information with parents, caregivers, educators, community members, and professionals who would like to learn more about addiction and mental health topics. If you want to learn more about how to support a child or youth that you live or work with, or if you want additional strategies for supporting your own wellness, you are welcome to register for these sessions.

• Caregiver Education Sessions

These online sessions are intended to provide parents, caregivers, teachers, and community members with introductory information regarding mental health challenges that can affect children and youth. This month, we are offering a **two-part lunch & learn webinar series** that focuses on **parenting strategies that promote positive mental health**. We will be looking at ways we can increase the 'wellness deposits' (protective factors) and decrease the 'wellness withdrawals' (risk factors) in our child's daily life to promote resilience.

• Adult Education Sessions (New!)

This month, we are offering two sessions around supporting mental health in adults! Join us for an **evening session** where we will look at ways to increase our own personal **resilience through caring, connecting, and coping**, or attend a **lunch & learn webinar** where we will discuss the symptoms and supportive strategies around **understanding depression**.
